THE WORKPLACE

The Miramichi Regional Hospital is a 160-bed regional hospital offering a full range of primary care and specialty services, including family medicine and hospitalist services, general and orthopedic surgery, internal medicine and intensive care, urology, obstetrics and gynecology, ophthalmology, pediatrics, anesthesiology, and pathology. Cardiac and trauma patients are transferred, when required, to regional referral centres.

The Geriatric Medicine service supports the care of older adults across inpatient units and in the outpatient geriatric clinic. The practice includes comprehensive geriatric assessment, management of frailty and complex multimorbidity, mobility and functional decline, and cognitive concerns. The program works closely with Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Hospitalist services, and community partners to support safe transitions of care.

Outpatient care is complemented by collaboration with the MINT memory clinic, where cognitive assessment and follow-up are supported by dedicated resources, including First Link through the Alzheimer Society of New Brunswick. There is also strong connection with community programs such as Nursing Home Without Walls, which supports many shared patients.



Physicians work closely with nursing in both inpatient and clinic settings and collaborate with occupational therapy and physiotherapy.

THE POSITION

The Miramichi Regional Hospital is actively seeking a full-time or part-time Geriatrician to join a collegial and supportive medical staff.

The role includes consultative inpatient work as well as outpatient geriatric clinic responsibilities, with flexibility to shape the clinical mix based on physician interest and community needs. The position offers the opportunity to focus on complex geriatric syndromes while partnering with the MINT clinic for memory-focused care.

Flexible scheduling options are available, including part-time arrangements. Call requirements are minimal and shared within the group. The team values collaboration, flexibility, and work-life balance and works together to accommodate scheduling and vacation requests.

THE OFFER

- This is a salaried position, with base range \$325,494-\$359,788
- Paid benefits include vacation and medical education leave, overhead and administrative support, and extended health benefits.
- Participation in the General Internal Medicine on-call service is optional and is remunerated additionally in a fee-for-service model. Our physicians enjoy unparalleled work-life balance.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide comprehensive geriatric assessments for hospitalized patients with complex medical needs

- Support care planning focused on functional recovery, cognitive health, and safe transitions of care
- Collaborate with nursing and community partners, including MINT and Nursing Home Without Walls, to support discharge planning and continuity of care
- Participate in quality improvement initiatives related to seniors' care and patient safety
- Teaching opportunities with medical students and residents may be available
