THE WORKPLACE

The Saint John Regional Hospital (SJRH) is New Brunswick's tertiary academic hospital and regional referral centre, with approximately **400 acute care beds**. Saint John is home to **Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick**, offering residency training programs in Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, and other specialties.

The Obstetrics & Gynecology service at SJRH provides comprehensive women's health care, including obstetrical services, gynecologic surgery, and the management of higher-acuity and complex cases. Physicians work within a highly collaborative, multidisciplinary academic environment with strong subspecialty support, including anesthesia, pediatrics, neonatology, internal medicine, and surgical services.

Opportunities may exist for physicians to support women's health services at other sites within the Saint John region, depending on interest and departmental needs.



THE POSITION

Physicians will practice clinically within the Obstetrics & Gynecology service and will be eligible for an **academic appointment with Dalhousie University**, with opportunities to participate in medical education, research, and continuing professional development activities.

Clinical excellence, a strong interest in teaching, and the ability to work effectively within interdisciplinary teams are essential attributes in this collegial academic environment.

The position includes obstetrical and gynecologic care with on-call responsibilities shared within the group. Flexible scheduling options are available. The department supports work-life balance and accommodates vacation and leave requests, with evolving supports for academic and professional development.

THE OFFER

A competitive remuneration model supports clinical practice and academic involvement. Physicians are compensated through a fee-for-service structure, with additional opportunities for academic, educational, or administrative funding where applicable.

Additional financial benefits offered by Horizon Health Network, the Government of New Brunswick, or the New Brunswick Medical Society may include:

- A recruitment incentive of **\$50,000** for a 2-year return-of-service commitment

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

The following outlines the basic responsibilities. Additional duties may be assigned as required to support the operation of Horizon Health Network:

- Provide comprehensive obstetrical and gynecologic care, including on-call responsibilities as defined by the department
- Participate in teaching, research, and academic activities consistent with an academic appointment at Dalhousie University
- Engage in medical practice aligned with Horizon Health Network's mission, values, and strategic priorities
- Contribute to quality improvement, patient safety, and departmental initiatives



YOUR QUALIFICATIONS

- A medical degree is required
- Certification (or eligibility for certification) with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Obstetrics & Gynecology
- Eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of New Brunswick
- Eligible for an academic appointment with Dalhousie University
- Proficiency in English is required; bilingual skills are considered an asset
- In accordance with immigration requirements, preference will be given to Canadian citizens and Permanent Residents of Canada
- Excellent communication, interpersonal, and team-based skills
- Good attendance and work record
- Physically able to perform assigned duties
